

## Cell Phone/Electronic Device Policy

Satellite High School students are permitted to use cell phones and electronic devices before school, during class change and during lunch each day. Devices must be put away during class time. No earbuds or listening devices are permitted while in class. Electronic devices are encouraged to be left in classrooms with student's belongings while on restroom passes.

Students are only permitted to utilize phones in class if their teacher gives them permission to use the phone for instructional purposes.

Except as authorized by a teacher or administrator, students may not capture, record, or transmit the words or sounds or pictures of any student, staff member or other person in the school or while attending a school related activity. Students who violate this rule and violate the privacy rights of any person may have their cell phone confiscated until a parent/guardian is able to pick it up and may be directed to delete the audio or picture file while the parent/guardian and possible confiscation of cell phone.

Students may not use a cell phone in any way that might create in the mind of another person an impression of being threatened, humiliated, harassed, embarrassed or intimidated.

Students are prohibited from using a cell phone to capture, record and/or transmit test information or any other information constituting fraud, theft, cheating or academic dishonesty.

Students are responsible for the care and security of any electronic devices. The school assumes no responsibility for theft, loss or damage to devices.

Parents/guardians are advised that the best way to get in touch with their child during the school day is by calling the school office.

**Fire drills, assemblies and all other school evacuations are considered cell phone blackouts - NO CELL PHONES MAY BE USED.**

## Satellite Dress Code

Satellite High School Policies are in accordance with those adopted by the School Board of Brevard County. Student dress should not be disruptive. Students are encouraged to dress using

modesty and good taste at school and school sponsored events. **Dress code enforcement begins upon arrival to campus until dismissal at 3:30 pm.**

## Head

- No hats, curlers, or bandanas are to be worn on campus at any time.
- Sunglasses are not permitted to be worn in the classroom, unless necessary.
- Extreme hairstyles, hair colors or makeup that is disruptive or obscene in contact is prohibited.
- Personal grooming is not permitted in the classroom.

## Upper Garments

- Garments must be of a length that are suitable to the build and stature of the student. The cut of sleeveless garments must not expose undergarments or be otherwise immodest.
- Strapless garments are prohibited. Straps of permitted garments must be at least 1/2 inch in width. Tubetops, halter necks, racerback tops are prohibited.
- Necklines of all upper garments must be modest.
- Low cut necklines are prohibited.
- Excessive jewelry or baggy clothes, which may conceal dangerous items, shall not be worn.
- Upper garments must adequately cover the waistline and must not be

## Lower Garments

- Pants shall conform to the build and stature of the student. Pants shall be worn at the waist and shall not extend beyond the heel of the shoe in length.
- Pants shall have NO holes or rips.
- Tights, Spandex, leggings, bikeshorts, are not permitted.
- Undergarments shall not be visible. (Sports bras are considered undergarments)
- Dresses and skirts - ~~thighs not below midlength~~ with waistband worn at waist level.
- Shorts must have clearly discernible seams and ~~short shorts~~ **Short shorts are prohibited.**
- Pajamas are prohibited.

## Footwear

Appropriate safe footwear must be worn.  
Bedroom slippers are prohibited.

## Accessories

- Clothing, jewelry, and accessories shall not convey messages that are profane, violence or death oriented, gothic, gang related, sexually suggestive, or promote alcohol, drugs or tobacco. Beachwear and see-through or otherwise revealing apparel is not considered appropriate.
- Clothing which contains vulgar, sexually explicit profanity, or drug use is not permitted.

## Physical education and swimming attire

Bathing suits are only permitted for swim classes and cannot be worn on campus undergarments. Only school approved 1 piece tank suits will be permitted. Exposed sports bras are allowed in PE classes. Physical education attire must be school approved.

## Consequences for Dress Code Violations

The above dress code will be enforced on campus daily. The administration reserves the right to determine what is appropriate. Students who violate the dress code will be placed on the disciplinary ladder. First offense is a Dean's detention and will progress up the discipline ladder. Parents may be called and students sent home to secure appropriate clothing. All classes missed because of inappropriate clothing will be unexcused and students will be placed on the disciplinary ladder.

## Tardy Policy

A tardy student disrupts the learning process; therefore, tardiness is generally considered unexcused. If a student is not in the classroom when the tardy bell has finished ringing, he/she is considered tardy. There will be no running or pushing to get to class on time. The first school bell rings at 8:41 a.m. with a tardy bell ringing for (4) minutes at the end of each class period to alert the teacher to dismiss class and students will have four (4) minutes to move to their next class. ~~MDearss.
